

About Operation Emotion

Operation Emotion is a Plymouth based charity, working across Devon aqnd Cornwall that provides services for adult male survivors of sexual abuse. As a trauma led service we specialise in groupwork, offering a range of self help initiatives and educational programmes that enable men to engage in a process of recovery.

We provide services that offer men a way out of the daily problems associated with the trauma of past sexual abuse. We also help men to come to terms with their own experiences and play an active role in helping others who have been similarly affected by these experiences. We also provide opportunities for men to, in time, help to educate wider society and challenge damaging myths and misinformation surrounding sexual abuse.

Our trustees are drawn from a variety of professional backgrounds and are skilled individuals, with a wide range of experiences, who are keen to promote an open healthy debate in society about the consequences of sexual abuse.

The board's objectives are to promote three areas of project development through **Education**, **Prevention and Campaigning**.



What we do

We provide weekly support groups that are a safe place for men to speak freely about what is bothering them without fear of being judged. These groups are friendly and supportive and also engage in wider social activities to help

combat isolation. They currently operate in Paignton and Pymouth and we will shortly launching a service in Truro.

Our work is broken down in to three strands:

- 1. Education
- 2. Campaigning
- 3. Prevention

We use film to campaign for a greater understanding in society concerning sexual abuse. We do this by producing films that challenge myths and misinformation as well as producing feature length dramas and educational short films.

We are keen to prevent the trauma of sexual abuse and work with a range of statutory and voluntary sector organisations to share best practice. We also work collaboratively with Devon Mind the national mental health charity and First Light who operate SARC and ISVA services. We also work within general practice providing clinics so that GPs can refer directly into our service. We provide ongoing educational courses, workforce development training and campaign widely for more responsive generic services.

Beneficiary case study

Martin spent thirty years in psychiatric care, having collected innumerous medical labels along the way. He had never been asked what was behind his presenting problems. He misused alcohol and eventually got the help he needed for this. His life improved but he was still struggling. He finally got help from Operation Emotion for the sexual abuse he had suffered as a child. Within 6 months he had transformed his life by tackling the cause of the problem - not just the symptoms.

Impact In Words

We operate weekly support groups 52 weeks a year to help tackle the traumatic consequences of sexual abuse. We provide telephone support for male survivors of sexual abuse.

We deliver a rolling programme of Education Recovery programmes throughout the year that help men to understand the effects of trauma and come to terms with it so that this no longer continues to dominate their lives.

We also run weekly GP clinics that act as a hub for wider GP referrals from neighbouring surgeries. We campaign, locally, regionally and nationally using film to challenge myths and misinformation. We produce educational shorts and feature films that promote best practice.

We run pop up screenings across the southwest and offer training to religious bodies and other organisations that need to improve their safeguarding arrangements.

We do this to promote a healthy open debate within wider society to inform and educate concerning the damaging consequences of sexual abuse.

We provide workplace development training for a variety of groups of staff concerning the impact and consequences of sexual abuse.







- We will continue to campaign for much needed improvements in services both regionally and nationally.
- We will expand our film unit and continue to make educational films and feature films that challenge myths and stereotypes and change people's perception about sexual abuse.

Prevention

- We will continue to work with our two partner organisations
 Devon Mind and First Light to have a greater influence
 within schools concerning child protection
- We will begin work taking our services into local prisons.
